## Dix Hills man killed at Islip Speedway

It was only the 11th lap of a 200-lap race at the Islip Speedway on Saturday, Aug. 28. Fred Harbach, of Huntington Station, one of the Tartans of the Islip track, was forced to pull into the center oval of the track for emergency repairs. His pit crew was working feverishly to get him back in the race when a modified Vega, driven by Robert Krillage of Elmhurst, reportedly went out-of-control and slammed into Harbach's crew and car, police said. Frank Cervone, 24, of Dix Hills, was killed by the accident and four others were injured: Joseph Bohue, of Huntington Station, Joseph Cypriano of Dix Hills, Fernando Espinel of Babylon and Paul Guzinski of Connecticut. The four who were injured have been treated and released from Southside Hospital.

Lt. Hans Dara of the Suffolk County Homicide Squad, said the cause of Krillage's accident is still under investigation.

### LSD arrest

Agents of the Suffolk County Department of Narcotics arrested two brothers from Dix Hills after they allegedly sold about 3,000 tabs of Lysergic acid diethylamide (LSD), with a street value of \$15,000, to undercover agents on Wednesday, Aug. 25, police said.

The arrest, at the International House of Pancakes on Old Walt Whitman Rd. in Huntington, was the culmination of a four month investigation by the department, police said. Police said Michael and Scott McGuire of Redwood Dr. in Dix Hills, had been distributing the acid in the Huntington and Brentwood areas and at various musical concerts throughout the country. They were charged with criminal sale

of a controlled substance in the second degree.

### Station holdup

The Sunoco gas station at the corner of Larkfield Rd. and Jericho Tpke. in East Northport was robbed again last week, the second hold-up there in two weeks.

Police said at about 2:45 a.m., on Tues. Aug. 24, a light blue Chevette or Toyota pulled up and a youth entered the office area. He began to ask for directions, police said, but, before he had an answer, he asked, "Have you ever been robbed?" With that he gestured outside to the car where his compatriot held a rifle out the window, according to a Second Squad detective. The attendant handed over \$35.

The robbers are described as white males, about 17-18 years old. One had blond hair, and was described as being 5-4, 135 lbs. The other had dark hair.

On Wednesday, Aug. 9, at about 4:45 a.m. the station was robbed of \$160 by a man who threatened the use of a gun, though none was seen.

Police said that Eric Carraturo, the man suspected of murdering 40-year-old Sheila Halloran at Snyder's bar-hotel last Monday

night, is being held without bail at the Suffolk County jail in Riverhead awaiting arraignment on Wednesday, Sept. 1. Carraturo, 36, a letter carrier for the Huntington post office, will be charged with second degree murder of Mrs. Halloran of Caldwell St. in Huntington, according to Second Squad detectives.

### Banner yet waves

The bright and dark side of America was played out at Pape Chevrolet on Oakwood Rd. last week. General manager John Dunn, erected an 80 foot flagpole outside the automobile showroom. And atop that 80 foot pole, on Tuesday, Aug. 24, he hoisted a 20 by 30 foot American flag, a 24-hour honor to the country in which his business flourishes. One couldn't help but marvel at it.

Then, sometime between 10 p.m. on Saturday night, Aug. 28 and 3 a.m. on Sunday, somebody shimmied 10-feet up that pole, cut the rope and stole the flag.

Dunn is not stymied however. His order has already been sent to Ohio for another flag and he expects it by Friday, Sept. 3. It costs \$740. Only this time, Dunn is taking a further precaution: the guidelines will be inside the pole.

**Q.** I am going to have a consultation with our orthodontist concerning my daughter's malocclusion. What should I be aware of?

- A.**
1. Most orthodontists have an initial fee which includes the consultation, records, and the insertion of appliances. If this is your first child going to this orthodontist and you are uncertain about utilizing his services ask him what the fee is for only the consultation and records, and do this before the records are taken.
  2. The orthodontist should describe to you what type of malocclusion your daughter has and how he plans to treat her.
  3. Should he say extractions are necessary. Have him explain why?
  4. What is the fee? Are there any extras you should be made aware of? Does this fee include retainers and retention period?
  5. Will you be required to take your daughter out of school for her treatments? How often?
  6. Does the doctor arrange appointments so you will not have a long waiting time?
  7. Is the office manager, staff and doctor polite and courteous?
  8. If you have any negative feelings at all about this consultation seek another opinion.
